

### **International Students:**

The College of Massage Therapy is not authorized to enroll nonimmigrant alien students.

### **Remedial Courses:**

We do not offer remedial or non-credit courses. The College of Massage Therapy provides students requesting information on obtaining a GED, with a list of test sites and related information.

### **Advanced Placement and Credit for Experiential Learning:**

The College of Massage Therapy does not provide students advanced placement to its courses, nor does it grant credit for experiential learning.

### **Transfer of Credit to College of Massage Therapy:**

The College of Massage Therapy considers credit from other institutions accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education (USDE) or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). The maximum number of hours the student is allowed to transfer to the College of Massage Therapy program is 50% of the total program hours.

### **Transfer of Credit from College of Massage Therapy:**

Transfer of credit for training received from the College of Massage Therapy to another institution is entirely up to the receiving institution. **College of Massage Therapy does not guarantee that another school will accept any of our credits.** We will provide academic information, in the form of a transcript, to the receiving school at the written request of the student. Students wishing to transfer credits to another school should contact the school to determine its policy of accepting credits.

### **Delivery of Services:**

All educational programs and services, provided at the College of Massage Therapy, are residential. That is to say, all programs and services are provided at the school's campus. College of Massage Therapy does not provide any education or training via distance education.

### **Student/Teacher Ratio:**

The student to teacher Ratio, at the College of Massage Therapy is approximately 1 instructor to every 16 students. Classes over 16 will have 2 instructors.
